This fund update was first made publicly available on 23 June 2023.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the MISS Scheme (Scheme) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the Scheme with other funds. The trustees of the MISS Scheme prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund


The Scheme targets a 40% allocation to growth assets (equities, listed property, and listed infrastructure) and a 60% allocation to income assets (fixed interest and cash and cash equivalents). The investment performance objective of the Scheme is to achieve a return, after tax and investment expenses that exceeds inflation by 1.25% per annum over the longer term (10 years). Over a rolling three-year period, the investment objectives of the Scheme are to:

- achieve a Scheme return, after tax and investment expenses, that exceeds the composite benchmark return by 1.0% per annum
- achieve a return in each asset class, after tax and investment expenses, that exceeds the relevant benchmark index return.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Scheme



Administration fee	The administration fee is recalculated each month so that the total administration fees deducted cover the monthly fees payable to Mercer (N.Z.) Limited. The administration fees charged for the year ended 31 March 2023 were \$201.29.
Insurance premium	\$250.20 per annum, which is payable by investors who have life insurance cover under the Scheme.



Example of how this applies to an investor

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Mary had \$10,000 in the Scheme at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Mary incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$296 (that is -2.96% of her initial \$10,000). Mary also paid \$451.49 in other charges. This gives Mary a total loss after tax of \$747.49 for the year.²
